CORAL REEF HABITAT

A coral reef is like a city under the sea!


It's made of tiny animals called coral polyps that live close together and build hard shells around themselves. Over time, these shells stack up and make big, colorful reefs where lots of ocean animals live! Animals that live in coral reef include :  Clownfish (like Nemo!),  Octopus,  Sea turtles,  Crabs,  Sea snails.




TIDE POOL HABITAT

A tide pool is a little pool of salty ocean water that's left behind on the beach when the tide goes out.

It's like a tiny ocean world you can explore!

- You can find tide pools in rocky areas near the shore, especially at low tide. Animals that live in coral reef include :  Shells,  Crabs hiding under rocks,  Seaweed waving in the water,  Starfish sticking to the rocks and  Sometimes even tiny octopuses!





WHALES

Read the text.

Whales are the biggest animals in the ocean. Some whales are even bigger than a bus! They live in the sea, but they are not fish. Whales are mammals. That means they breathe air, have warm blood, and take care of their babies.

There are two main kinds of whales: baleen whales and toothed whales. Baleen whales eat tiny animals called krill. They use special bristles in their mouth to catch food. Toothed whales, like orcas, eat fish and squid. Whales talk to each other with sounds. Some sing songs that can be heard far away! Whales swim in groups and sometimes jump out of the water. That is called breaching.

Whales are amazing animals that need our help to stay safe. We can protect the oceans by keeping them clean.

SEAHORSES



Read the text.

Seahorses are tiny sea animals that live in warm, shallow water. They are called seahorses because their heads look like the head of a horse!

Seahorses are not fast swimmers. They use a small fin on their back to move through the water. They often hold on to seaweed with their tails so they don't drift away.

One very special thing about seahorses is that the daddy carries the babies! The mother puts the eggs into a pouch on the dad's belly. Later, baby seahorses come out of the pouch.

Seahorses eat tiny sea animals like shrimp. They use their long snouts to suck up food—like a straw!



JELLYFISH



Read the text.

Jellyfish are sea animals that float in the ocean. They have soft, squishy bodies and long, stinging tentacles. Jellyfish can be clear, pink, blue, or even glow in the dark!

Even though they are called fish, jellyfish are not really fish. They don't have bones, brains, or hearts. But they can still swim and catch food!

Jellyfish use their tentacles to sting tiny animals and bring them to their mouths. Some jellyfish stings can hurt people, so it's best to look but not touch.

Jellyfish move by pulsing their bodies like umbrellas opening and closing. They float with the water and sometimes glow at night.

An octopus is a sea animal with eight arms. It lives in the ocean, hiding in rocks and coral. Each arm has little suckers that help it grab things.

Octopuses are very smart. They can solve puzzles and even open jars! They like to hide from predators by squeezing into small spaces.

If an octopus feels scared, it can squirt out dark ink to get away. It can also change color to blend in with the ocean. This is called camouflage.

Octopuses eat crabs, fish, and other small sea animals. They catch food with their arms and bring it to their mouth, which is in the middle of their body.

STARFISH



Read the text.

Starfish are animals that live in the ocean. They are called starfish because their bodies look like stars! Most starfish have five arms, but some can have more.

Starfish don't have bones, brains, or blood. Instead, they have tiny tubes on their arms that help them move and hold onto rocks.

If a starfish loses an arm, it can grow a new one! This is called regeneration. Starfish are slow movers, but they are strong and clever. They eat clams and oysters by opening their shells and using their stomachs to eat the soft inside.
